

I know some of you had issues with the folens website last week however it seems the issue has been resolved. If you have any difficulties with it this week please let me know.

Maths

- Practice and revise addition and subtraction tables.
- This week we will learn all about weight. Weight tells us how heavy an object is and is measured in grams and kilograms.
 $1,000g = 1kg$ $500g = \frac{1}{2}kg$
- Discuss why and where you would use a scales e.g in a supermarket weighing fruit or veg, at the butchers, post office, airport etc.
- This is a very practical and hands on topic. It would be a great idea to make your own balance scale using a hanger, string, cups etc. Below are some ideas.



1st Class

- Operation Maths book p.131-134
 - You could also find different items in your house and arrange according to weight starting with the lightest.

- Fill boxes/containers with different weights using stones/sand/flour etc and encourage your child to guess which is the heaviest without handling the boxes and explain their reasoning. Ensure the biggest box is the lightest and reinforce afterwards that the biggest item does not necessarily mean it will be the heaviest.
- Find items in your house that weight 1kg and/or find items in your kitchen cupboard heavier/lighter than a kg.

2nd Class

- Operation Maths book p. 69-72
 - Discuss if big objects are always heavy and small objects are always light. Think of a large object that is light and a small object that is heavy.
 - Using the balance scales choose an item that would be best for balancing a pencil - a bag of rice, pencil case or ruler. Discuss the predictions and test.
 - Find items at home that are heavier, lighter or the same as a $\frac{1}{2}$ kg.
 - Which do you think weighs more a bag of sugar or a bag of pasta/a tin of tomatoes or a bag of rice/ a banana or an apple? Estimate and weigh.
